Views of COVID-19 in Wyoming - 4/27/20

A snapshot survey of Wyoming residents April 27th, 2020

This WyoSpeaks survey of Wyoming citizens was conducted over the course of 24 hours beginning on April 27th at 7:00 AM. The survey was designed to gauge public opinion on a number of topics related to COVID-19 (Coronavirus) and approval ratings for how the president, congress, our governor, and local officials are handling the crisis. This is the second iteration of our COVID-19 tracking survey, which will be fielded at regular intervals to collect information about the changing views of Wyoming residents over time.

Methodology

This brief presents the results of the third of multiple surveys planned in 2020 to measure public opinion on a number of topics related to COVID-19 (Coronavirus) and approval ratings for how government officials are handling the related crisis.

The survey was conducted among a randomly selected sample of Wyoming residents who are members of the Wyoming Survey & Analysis Center's (WYSAC) WyoSpeaks panel of Wyoming citizens.

The survey was conducted online for 24 hours, with the first email invitations sent to selected respondents at 7:00 AM on April 27th, 2020. A total of 1,264 WyoSpeaks panel members were drawn into the survey sample, and 496 completed the

survey. When factoring in bad email addresses and quota screen outs, we are left with a response rate of 46%.

The survey instrument contains questions developed internally, as well as questions developed from the Great Lakes Poll, fielded by Baldwin Wallace University.

The survey implemented a quota for age, with the quota sizes based on data from the 2013-2017 American Community Survey 5-year estimates. The quota approach was used to maximize the representativeness of the initial survey responses so that less data weighting was required after data collection closed.

The survey results are weighted by gender, age, and respondent county. The overall margin of error for questions asked of all respondents is ±4.4 percentage points. Total column percentages may not add to 100% due to rounding error. This project is funded internally by WYSAC.

About WyoSpeaks

The mission of WyoSpeaks is to give voice to Wyoming citizens on important issues facing our state and make public policy more responsive to the opinions of our citizens.

WYSAC's WyoSpeaks survey panel uses probability-based sampling methods to monitor the perspectives of Wyoming citizens through online surveys. WyoSpeaks surveys allow researchers to draw statistically valid inferences about the state as a whole. Over the course of a year, the Wyoming Survey & Analysis Center conducts a number of state-wide telephone surveys where all Wyoming residents have an equal probability of selection. During these surveys, respondents are given the opportunity to join the WyoSpeaks panel of Wyoming citizens. The only way to be added to the WyoSpeaks panel is through this random selection process. WyoSpeaks offers researchers, agencies, and organizations a cost-effective alternative to focus groups and robust telephone and mail surveys with a quick turnaround of statistically valid and reliable results.

Key Findings

This survey, conducted Monday April 27th, is the third of multiple surveys WYSAC plans to field to measure public opinion on a number of topics related to COVID-19. A total of 496 Wyoming residents participated in the survey representing all Wyoming counties, with a margin of error of plus or minus 4.4 percentage points.

Complete survey results, along with charts and figures, can be found in the main body of the report. Here are some of this survey's key findings:

- Approval for the way Wyoming Governor Mark Gordon is handling the COVID-19 crisis remains high, with 75 percent saying they *strongly approve* or *somewhat approve* of the way he is handling things. Governor Gordon's net approval rating (approval minus disapproval) remains high at plus 54 percentage points.
- Approval for the way President Donald Trump is handling the COVID-19 crisis decreased slightly, with 59 percent saying they *strongly approve* or *somewhat approve* of the way he is handling things. President Trump's net approval rating decreased by 5.6 percentage points to plus 20.5 percentage points.
- Approval for the way local government and health officials are handling the COVID-19 crisis remains high, with 77 percent saying they *strongly approve* or *somewhat approve* of the way they are handling things. The net approval remains high for this group at plus 59 percentage points.
- Concern about the impact of COVID-19 on the economy continues to increase, with 76 percent saying they are *very concerned*.
- Support for major policies to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 continue to decline:
 - 76 percent say they support the closure of K-12 schools, a decrease of 8 percentage points.
 - 67 percent say they support the closure of daycare centers, a decrease of 11 percentage points.
 - 64 percent say they support the closure of restaurants and bars, a decrease of 12 percentage points.
 - 74 percent say they support the limiting of public gatherings, a decrease of 8 percentage points.
 - 44 percent say they support a "shelter-in-place" order, a decrease of 4 percentage points.
- Fewer Wyomingites say they are following the news about COVID-19 *very closely* 43 percent say this is the case, a decrease of 6 percentage points two weeks ago, and a decrease of 14 points from a month ago.
- More Wyoming residents say they believe *the worst is behind us* (20 percent) than did two weeks ago (14 percent). 37 percent of residents say *the worst is yet to come*, a decrease of 10 points from two weeks ago.

- While the number of people in Wyoming who say they have not changed their daily routine because of COVID-19 remains steady (12.5 percent), there has been an observable shift from those who say they have changed it a lot to those that say they have changed it a little. Nearly 48 percent of residents say they have changed their routine a lot, a decrease of nearly 7 points from two weeks ago. Alternatively, nearly 40 percent say they have changed their routine a little an increase of nearly 5 points.
 - 71 percent of residents say they are avoiding physical contact with others, a decrease of 8 percentage points from two weeks ago.
 - 46 percent say they are avoiding houses of worship, and 47 percent say they are declining visits from friends and family – a decrease of roughly 5 points for each from two weeks ago.
 - Fewer residents say they are spending more time at home in response to the COVID-19 crisis (73 percent) than said they were two weeks ago (78 percent).
 - There is a 9 percentage point decrease in the proportion of residents who say they are following the news more closely as a change to their daily routine – down to 47 percent from 56 percent two weeks ago.
 - More residents report that they are wearing PPE in public spaces than said so two weeks ago, with almost half (49 percent) saying they now do this – in increase of 4 percentage points.
- Fewer Wyoming residents feel COVID-19 is a *real threat* that did two weeks ago, with 54 percent saying so now a decrease of 7 points from two weeks ago. Alternatively, 36 percent say it is *blown out of proportion* an increase of 7 points.
- There is a trend of an increasing proportion of residents who say they are *very unlikely* to get a vaccine for COVID-19 if one becomes available, with 19 percent saying they are *very unlikely to* now. Two weeks ago, 15 percent said they were *very unlikely* while a month ago 10 percent said this.
- Of those that report that they or someone in their family has been laid off or lost their job (35 percent), 64 percent say that it is likely that job or employment will return. 20 percent say it is unlikely, while 17 percent are unsure if this job will return.
- Of those that report that they or someone in their family has had work hours or pay cut (57 percent), 73 percent say that it is likely that these hours or pay will be restored. 15 percent say it is unlikely, while 12 percent are unsure if these hours or pay will be restored.
- Significantly fewer residents say they have had problems in the last two weeks buying the groceries and/or household items they need. 62 percent of residents say they have experienced problems buying groceries or other food items a decrease of 15 points from two weeks ago. 49 percent say they have experienced difficulty purchasing household items, a decrease of 18 points from two weeks ago.



Do you approve or disapprove of the way President Donald Trump is handling COVID-19 (coronavirus)?





Do you approve or disapprove of the way Governor Mark Gordon is handling COVID-19 (coronavirus)?





Do you approve or disapprove of the way Congress is handling COVID-19 (coronavirus)?



Do you approve or disapprove of the way your local government and health officials are handling COVID-19 (coronavirus)?



How concerned are you about the impact of COVID-19 (coronavirus) on the economy – if at all?



How concerned are you about the impact of COVID-19 (coronavirus) on your personal finances – if at all?





Many states have enacted policies to slow the spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus). Do you support or oppose the following decisions? (% Support)



How closely are you following the news about COVID-19 (coronavirus) – if at all?



Are you worried that you or someone in your immediate family might catch COVID-19 (coronavirus)?



Do you feel anxious about the spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus) in the United States?



Do you feel anxious about the spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus) in Wyoming?



Which of the following best describes your feelings about COVID-19 (coronavirus) in the United States?







Would you say that you have confidence in the U.S. healthcare system to handle the response to COVID-19 (coronavirus), or not?



Would you say that you have confidence in the Wyoming healthcare system to handle the response to COVID-19 (coronavirus), or not?



Do you think COVID-19 (coronavirus) is a real threat or blown out of proportion?



Do you trust the information you hear about COVID-19 (coronavirus) from President Donald Trump?



Do you trust the information you hear about COVID-19



Do you trust the information you hear about COVID-19





(coronavirus) from the national news media?



Do you trust the information you hear about COVID-19 (coronavirus) from your local news media?






