Views of COVID-19 in Wyoming - 7/14/20

A snapshot survey of Wyoming residents July 14th, 2020

This WyoSpeaks survey of Wyoming citizens was conducted over the course of 24 hours beginning on July 14 at 7:00 AM. The survey is designed to gauge public opinion on a number of topics related to COVID-19 (Coronavirus) and approval ratings for how the president, congress, our governor, and local officials are handling the crisis. This is the fifth iteration of our COVID-19 tracking survey, which will be fielded at regular intervals to collect information about the changing views of Wyoming residents over time.

Methodology

This brief presents the results of the sixth of multiple surveys planned in 2020 to measure public opinion on a number of topics related to COVID-19 (Coronavirus) and approval ratings for how government officials are handling the related crisis.

The survey was conducted among a randomly selected sample of Wyoming residents who are members of the Wyoming Survey & Analysis Center's (WYSAC) WyoSpeaks panel of Wyoming citizens.

The survey was conducted online for 24 hours, with the first email invitations sent to the selected respondents at 7:00 AM on July 14th, 2020. A total of 1405 WyoSpeaks panel members were drawn into the survey sample; 504 completed the survey.

When factoring in bad email addresses and quota screen outs, we are left with a response rate of 39%.

The survey instrument contains questions developed internally, as well as questions included in the Great Lakes Poll, fielded by Baldwin Wallace University.

The survey implemented a quota for age, with the quota sizes based on data from the 2013-2017 American Community Survey 5-year estimates. The quota approach was used to maximize the representativeness of the initial survey responses so that less data weighting was required after data collection closed.

The survey results are weighted by gender, age, and respondent' county. The overall margin of error for questions asked of all respondents is ±4.4 percentage points. Total column percentages may not add to 100% due to rounding error. This project is funded internally by WYSAC.

About WyoSpeaks

The mission of WyoSpeaks is to give voice to Wyoming citizens on important issues facing our state and make public policy more responsive to the opinions of our citizens.

WYSAC's WyoSpeaks survey panel uses probability-based sampling methods to monitor the perspectives of Wyoming citizens through online surveys. WyoSpeaks surveys allow researchers to draw statistically valid inferences about the state as a whole. Over the course of a year, the Wyoming Survey & Analysis Center conducts a number of state-wide telephone surveys where all Wyoming residents have an equal probability of selection. During these surveys, respondents are given the opportunity to join the WyoSpeaks panel of Wyoming citizens. The only way to be added to the WyoSpeaks panel is through this random selection process. WyoSpeaks offers researchers, agencies, and organizations a cost-effective alternative to focus groups and robust telephone and mail surveys with a quick turnaround of statistically valid and reliable results.

Key Findings

This survey, conducted Monday July 14th, is the sixth of multiple surveys WYSAC plans to field to measure public opinion on a number of topics related to COVID-19. A total of 504 Wyoming residents participated in the survey representing all Wyoming counties, with a margin of error of plus or minus 4.4 percentage points.

Complete survey results, along with charts and figures, can be found in the main body of the report. Here are some of this survey's key findings:

- Over half (56%) of Wyoming residents say they would support an ordinance that required people in their community to wear a facemask when in an indoor public place.
- Just over a third (36%) of Wyoming residents say they would support an ordinance that required people in their community to wear a facemask when in **an outdoor public place.**
- Comfort levels for attending outdoor events in Wyoming this summer and fall have decreased since June, with 45% of residents saying they would be comfortable attend an outdoor event with **up to 250 people** down from 56% in June. When considering outdoor events with **more than 250 people**, 40% of residents say they would be comfortable attending down from 52% in June.
- Residents were asked a series of questions regarding things that might make them more
 or less likely to attend an outdoor event this summer or fall:
 - o 40% say they would be more likely to attend if **facemasks are required by all attendees**, while 35% said they would be less likely.
 - 31% say they would be more likely to attend if there are special "Safe zones" or similarly designated areas where face mask use and social distancing is required and enforced, 25% say this they would be less likely
 - o If **facemask use is optional**, 23% say they are more likely to attend while 40% say they are less likely to attend.
 - o If **all attendees have a temperature check upon entry**, 38% say they are more likely to attend, while 16% say they are less likely to attend.
 - o If **hand sanitizing stations are available throughout the venue**, 47% say they are more likely to attend, while 4% say they would be less likely to attend.
 - 42% say they would be more likely to attend an outdoor event if social
 distancing rules for attendees are enforced everywhere at the event, while 24%
 say they would be less likely to attend.
 - o If there are maximum occupancy/attendee numbers are enforced to promote social distancing, 44% said they would be more likely to attend, while 17% say they would be less likely to attend.
 - o If **there are no social distancing rules**, 15% say they are more likely to attend, while 53% say they are less likely to attend an outdoor event this summer or fall.

- Since the last survey iteration on June 8th, there is an increase in the proportion of residents who support policies enacted to limit public gatherings with 61% saying they support this, an increase of 4 percentage points. Support for the closure of K-12 schools, closure of daycare centers, closure of bars and restaurants, and support for a "shelter in place" order all continued to decline.
- Concerns related to COVID-19 increased for almost all aspects in this survey iteration, a reversal of the downward trend observed since March.
 - 25% say they are very anxious about the spread of COVID-19 in the United states (+13 points since June).
 - o 17% say they are very anxious about the spread of COVID-19 in Wyoming (+9 points since June).
 - 45% of residents think that the worst is yet to come in the United States (+19 points since June.)
 - 42% of residents think that the worst is yet to come in Wyoming (+14 points since June.)
 - When asked if they think COVID-19 is a real threat or blown out of proportion,
 53% believe it is a real threat, an increase of 9 points since June.
 - 23% of residents now say they are worried someone in their immediate family might catch COVD-19, an increase of 9 points since June.
- Approval of the way Gov. Mark Gordon is handling the COVID-19 crisis remains high, with 66 percent saying they strongly approve or somewhat approve of the way he is handling things. Gordon's net approval rating (approval minus disapproval) is at plus 35 percent.
- Approval of the way President Donald Trump is handling the COVID-19 decreases significantly, with 49 percent saying they strongly approve or somewhat approve of the way he is handling things. President Trump's net approval rating a plus 2 points, down from plus 17 points in June.
- Regarding the way local government and health officials are handling the COVID-19 crisis, 66 percent say they strongly approve or somewhat approve of the way they are handling things.
- Approval of the way Congress is handling the COVID-19 crisis decreased 7 percentage points, with 25 percent saying they strongly approve or somewhat approve of the way Congress is handling things. The net approval rating for congress is minus 39 percentage points.



Do you approve or disapprove of the way President Donald Trump is handling COVID-19 (coronavirus)?




Figure 2Do you approve or disapprove of the way Governor Mark Gordon is handling COVID-19 (coronavirus)?

Figure 3Do you approve or disapprove of the way Congress is handling COVID-19 (coronavirus)?





Do you approve or disapprove of the way your local government and health officials are handling COVID-19 (coronavirus)?



How concerned are you about the impact of COVID-19 (coronavirus) on the economy – if at all?



How concerned are you about the impact of COVID-19 (coronavirus) on your personal finances - if at all?





Many states have enacted policies to slow the spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus). Do you support or oppose the following decisions? (% Support)



How closely are you following the news about COVID-19 (coronavirus) – if at all?



Are you worried that you or someone in your immediate family might catch COVID-19 (coronavirus)?



Do you feel anxious about the spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus) in the United States?



Do you feel anxious about the spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus) in Wyoming?




Which of the following best describes your feelings about COVID-19 (coronavirus) in the United States?



Would you say that you have confidence in the U.S. healthcare system to handle the response to COVID-19 (coronavirus), or not?



Would you say that you have confidence in the Wyoming healthcare system to handle the response to COVID-19 (coronavirus), or not?



Do you think COVID-19 (coronavirus) is a real threat or blown out of proportion?



Do you trust the information you hear about COVID-19 (coronavirus) from President Donald Trump?



Do you trust the information you hear about COVID-19 (coronavirus) from Governor Mark Gordon?



Do you trust the information you hear about COVID-19 (coronavirus) from your local government and health officials?




Do you trust the information you hear about COVID-19 (coronavirus) from the national news media?

Figure 21Do you trust the information you hear about COVID-19 (coronavirus) from your local news media?





Because of the COVID-19 (coronavirus) outbreak, have you or has anyone in your immediate family... (% yes)







In the past two weeks when you are in an indoor public place, how often do you wear a facemask?



How comfortable or uncomfortable would you be attending an outdoor event in Wyoming this summer or fall with **up to 250 people**?




