# Wyoming Primary Election Survey, 2022

A survey of Wyoming residents and likely GOP primary voters

August 10, 2022

This survey was conducted July 25-Aug. 6, yielding 836 responses from Wyoming residents, including 562 identified as likely voters in the Aug. 16 Republican Party primary. The margin of error for the GOP primary questions is plus or minus 4.1 percentage points. The margin of error for the statewide questions is plus or minus 3.4 percentage points.

### Methodology

This brief presents the results of 2022 Wyoming Primary Election Survey. The live interviewer telephone survey was fielded to a random sample of cell phone and landline telephone numbers in Wyoming, resulting in 70% of completed surveys on cell phones. The sampling frame was designed so that nearly every telephone number in Wyoming had an equal probability of selection for this project.

The survey was conducted from July 25<sup>th</sup> through August 6<sup>th</sup>, yielding 836 responses from Wyoming residents, including 562 identified as likely voters in the Aug. 16 Republican Party primary.

The survey instrument contains questions developed internally by the School of Politics, Public Affairs, and International Studies (SPPAIS) and the Wyoming Survey & Analysis Center (WYSAC) at the University of Wyoming.

The statewide survey results are weighted by gender, age, and respondent' county. The overall margin of error for questions asked of all respondents is ±3.4 percentage points. The GOP primary survey results are weighted by gender and Republican Party voter registration statistics at the county level. The margin of error for the GOP primary questions is ±4.1 percentage points

Total column percentages may not add to 100% due to rounding error. This project is funded by the School of Politics, Public Affairs, and International Studies (SPPAIS), the Wyoming Survey & Analysis Center (WYSAC), and Wyoming Public Media (WPM).

### **Topline Survey Results**

The study was conducted by the Wyoming Survey & Analysis Center via live interviewer telephone. Interviews were conducted from July 25 – Aug. 6, 2022, among a random sample of cell phone and landline telephone numbers believed to be in Wyoming. Respondents determined to be likely voters in the GOP primary were asked a subset of questions about that election.

#### **Margins of Error**
