# Approach and Methodology

## *Questionnaire Design*

The questionnaire used for the 2024 Wyoming Election Survey was based on the questionnaire used in all previous iterations of this recurring survey. For 2024, SPPAIS refined and reorganized the questions, as well as eliminated questions that were no longer of interest or not applicable.

## *Sample Design*

The Wyoming Election Year Survey (WEYS) is an overlapping dual-frame RDD telephone survey. “Dual-frame” refers to sampling both the landline and cell phone frames. “Overlap” refers to the telephone survey methodology where dual users, individuals who can be reached on both the cell phone and the landline frames, can come from either frame.<sup>1</sup> This frame is widely considered to provide the most coverage in the state, and provides equal opportunity for all Wyoming residents to be selected to participate in the survey.

The eligible population was noninstitutionalized adults 18 years of age and older.

All phones were treated as a single-user device. The adult aged 18 or older reached via a cell phone that answered the phone was selected. For records with an email address and/or a mailing address appended, those who had completed the survey online were treated as single users and no random selection within the household was performed.

Telephone sample for this project was purchased from our scientific survey sample vendor, Marketing System Group (MSG). The two frames utilized were Listed Landline frame (Listed LL), and the Advanced Cellular Frame (ACF). The Listed LL frame consists of all listed landline telephone numbers in Wyoming. The Advanced Cellular Frame, a proprietary MSG product, includes both listed and RDD frames, providing the best opportunity to include nearly every cellular telephone in our target geography. Importantly, this frame includes the in-ward migration population in Wyoming that may have a number from another geography.

For both sample frames (Listed LL and ACF), MSG appended known mailing address and known email address, where possible. MSG updates this information daily from over 200

authoritative sources, such as those used in identity authentication and validation of digital transactions.

## *Sample Management*

Upon receipt of the survey sample, email invitations were fielded to all who had a valid email address associated with the phone record. Then, an invitation letter that encouraged completing the survey on the web was sent to all with a valid mailing address appended (who did not respond to the email, if applicable). Sample with no email or mailing address information were fielded in the phone mode only. For records with email append and/or mailing address append, records were moved to the phone mode after the email and/or mailing efforts occurred and no final disposition was achieved.

For the landline sample, only numbers which were not pre-screened as disconnected, cellphone, or businesses were released for calling. For the cellular sample, MSG's screening service was used to prescreen non-working cellular numbers from the cellular sample prior to telephone fielding.

In total, 24,000 cellular telephone numbers were generated for this study from the ACF frame and 2,000 landline telephone numbers were generated from the Listed LL frame. After removing those sample members pre-screened by the sample provider as disconnected, non-working, or business numbers, 11,255 valid cellular numbers and 965 valid landline numbers remained for fielding (12,220 total records).

A total of 6,393 sample records had an email match to which were sent a single email invitation and one reminder. A total of 7,511 records had a valid mailing address match, making them eligible for a paper invite to the web – this includes all of the 6,393 sample members with an email address. Paper invitations were sent to all records for which no final disposition was achieved during the email effort. Finally, a total of 17,337 attempts were made by phone to those that did not respond via email or letter (or did not have that information appended) in an effort to reach a final disposition.

## *Fielding Period*

Individuals who had valid emails were invited to complete the survey via email. Initial email invites were emailed to individuals on 9/24/2024. An email reminder was sent to those who did not respond to the initial email invite on 10/16/2024. Invite letters that encouraged individuals to complete the survey via the web were mailed to individuals who did not have an appended email address on 9/30/2024. A second invitation letter was mailed to those who had not responded to the email invitation on 10/6/2024. All remaining unresolved cases, including those

with no email or mail information appended, were fielded via phone starting on 10/15/2024. Well-trained WYSAC telephone interviewers conducted the telephone interviews. Calling began on 10/15/2024 and concluded on 10/27/2024. Throughout the fielding period, calling took place on Sunday through Thursday evenings until 9 PM, as well as Friday and Saturday afternoon beginning at noon.

## *Response Rates*

A total of 436 completed surveys were received on the web as a result of the email and/or letter invitation effort. From the follow-up phone mode, an additional 303 surveys were completed. A total of 739 surveys were completed from a random selection of adults in Wyoming. Survey samples of this size yield a margin of error of approximately plus-or-minus 3.6 percentage points for survey questions asked of the entire respondent pool.

## *Weighting*

The respondents' county of residence is defined by the respondent supplied county; it is not defined by the county assigned by the frame. For the 2 (0.3%) respondents who did not provide county of residence, we impute the county of residence from the frame data.

All respondents are required to have nonmissing values for the distributions used in the weighting procedure. To impute missing values of region, we assigned the region using the associated frame data. For the other variables used in the calibration, we applied a Hot-Deck imputation procedure to impute for the missing values, which were then used in the weighting procedure.

The variables used in the weighting procedure were: Age Group, Gender, County of Residence, Party Affiliation<sup>2</sup>, and Educational Attainment<sup>3</sup>.

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<sup>2</sup> Party Affiliation benchmark is the Wyoming Secretary of State Voter Registration Statistics, October 2024. Missing values for this variable (non-registered, no-answer/don't know) were imputed for the weighting procedure from the "Which party do you consider yourself" variable (asked of all) or via hot-deck imputation procedure.

<sup>3</sup> Benchmarks for Age, Gender, County, and Education were obtained from U.S. Census Bureau, Population Division, 2022 estimates.
